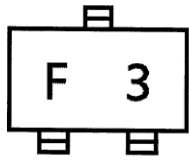
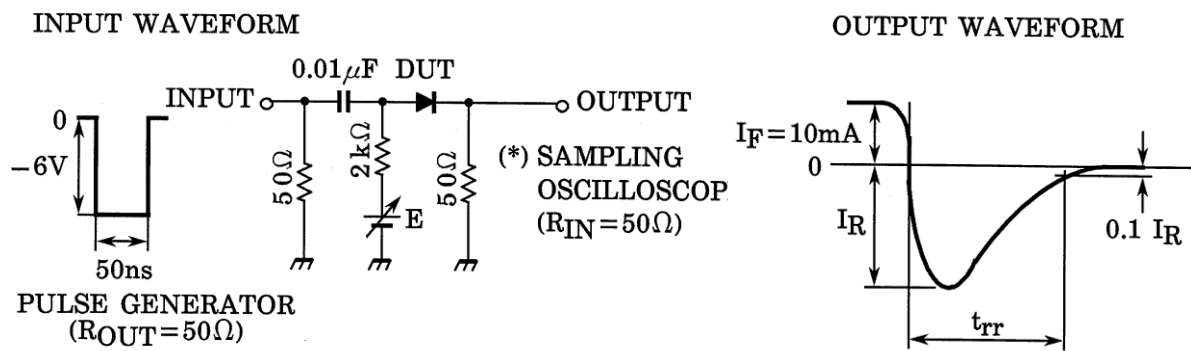
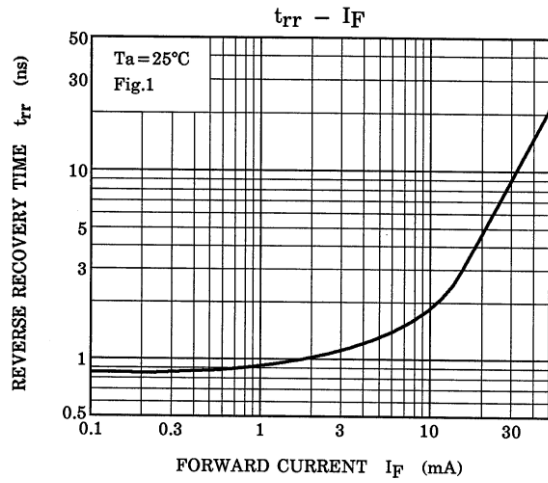
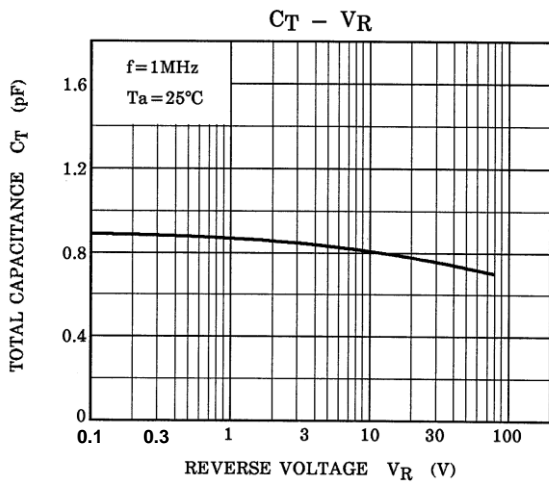
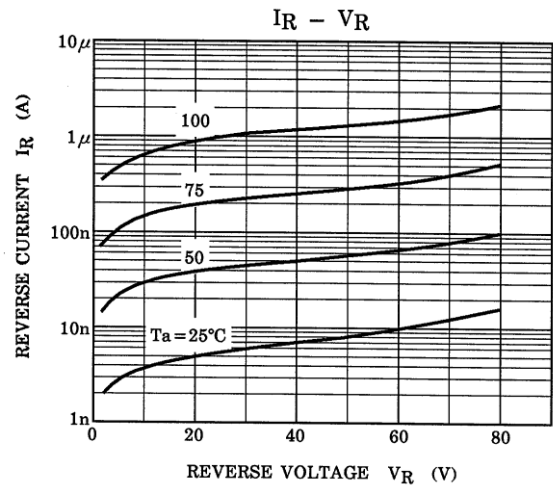
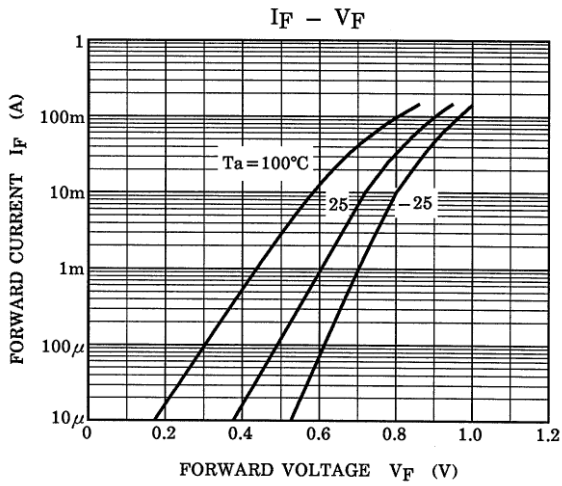


Fig.1 Reverse recovery time (t_{rr}) test circuit





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
