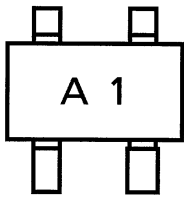
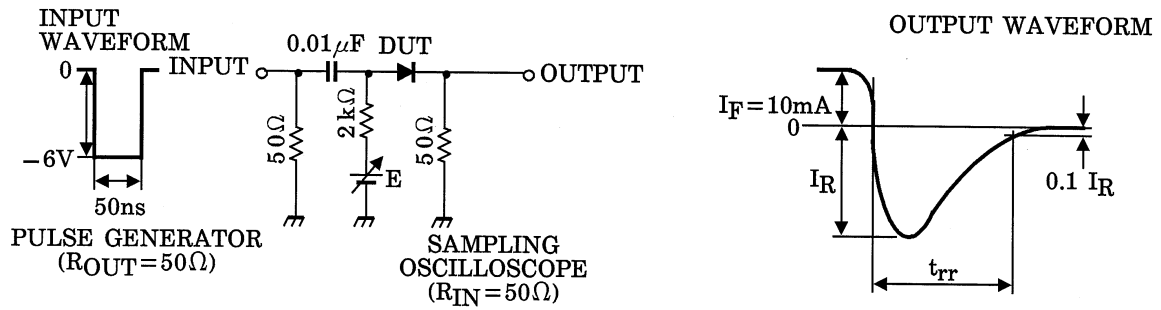
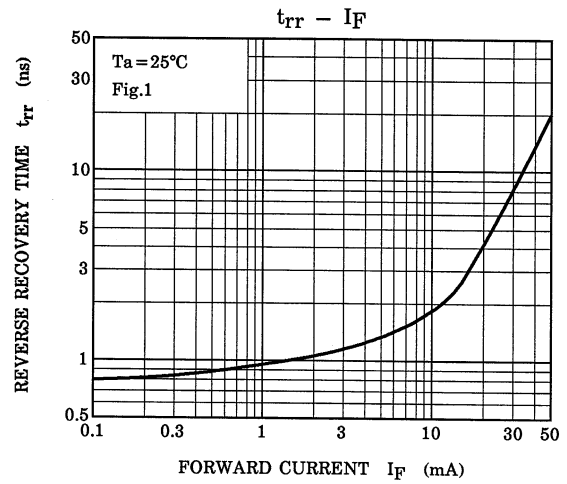
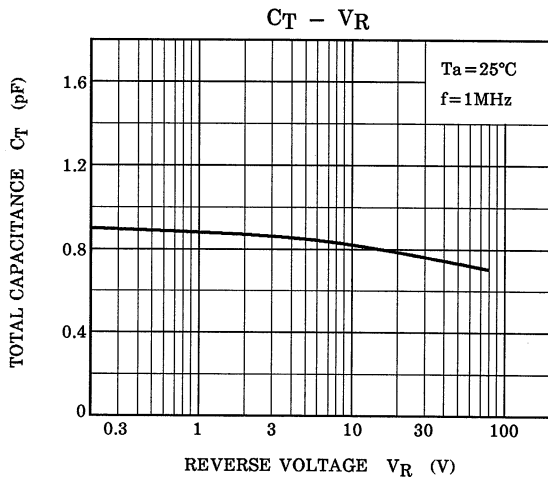
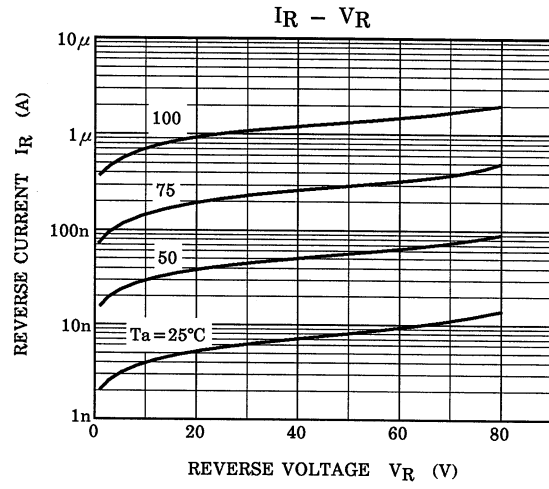
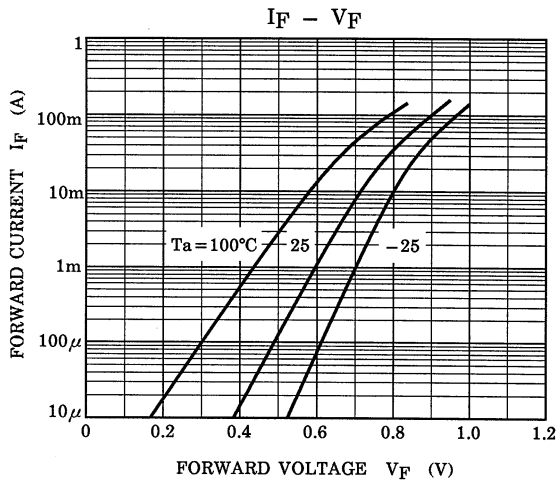


Fig.1 Reverse recovery time ( $t_{rr}$ ) test circuit





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
